

Curriculum overview – Year 1

This half term our Core Stories are ‘Little Houses’ and ‘The Three Little Pigs’



Subject	We will be learning...	How you can help
SMSEC – Social, Moral, Spiritual, Emotional and Cultural	<p>This half term we will be continuing to use our PATHs programme, thinking about friendships and feelings, learning to recognise how we are feeling and how other people are feeling. We will also be following our whole school focus on ‘Caring’.</p>	<p>Talk to your child about their school day and the things that they have enjoyed doing. Talk about how you feel in different situations. Explain that it is ok to have uncomfortable feelings and talk about ways to resolve them.</p>
English	<p>Through our core story, we will encourage children talk about a story, create their own captions and re-tell and role-play. We will also write our own versions of the Three Little Pigs. Through our work on these books and in our Big Write sessions we will be using correct punctuation – capital letters, full stops and finger spaces. We will be using adjectives to make our sentences interesting.</p> <p>In our phonics sessions, we will continue to develop our knowledge of the sounds that letters make and practise blending them to help us spell and read.</p>	<p>Share their school reading book at home daily and share other stories too. Talk about the story and the pictures, predicting events and talking about the characters.</p> <p>Look for capital letters and lower case letters in what they read. Identify where they are found in sentences. Try writing the alphabet in capitals and in lower case letters.</p>
Maths	<p>This half term we will be consolidating our counting and ordering skills working with numbers to 20. We will be adding and subtracting within 20 using resources such as numicon, counters and numberlines to help us. We will also be naming 2D and 3D shapes and talking about their properties.</p>	<p>Take opportunities to practise counting skills recognising patterns such as odd and even. Practice writing numerals to 20. Look for shapes, both 2D and 3D, in the environment, name them and talk about the numbers of sides and corners.</p>
History and Geography	<p>We will be finding out about different types of houses and houses around the world. We will be looking at ways we can use technology to enhance our learning and finding out how to use it safely.</p>	<p>Talk to your child about your house, naming parts such as the roof, walls etc and room names. Talk about how the houses locally are the same or different to your own. Find out about a traditional house from another country - think about why it is built the way it is.</p>



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Art and Design	<p>We will be making collages and models of different houses as well as producing art work themed on Autumn and the Harvest. In our outdoor week (24th Sept) we will be beginning to build a milk –bottle igloo.</p>	<p>If you use 4 pint plastic milk bottles, please wash them out and bring them into school for our igloo building challenge! Please encourage family and friends to save them for us too!</p>
Physical Education	<p>This term we will be learning about Moving and Travelling – focussing on controlling our movements and bodies to produce short dances and develop gymnastic skills.</p>	<p>Try out different ways of moving around – running, hopping, crawling, skipping.</p>
Science	<p>We will begin a year-long exploration of the seasons and weather, noting the changes that happen throughout the year. We will be learning about different materials and their properties and considering how effective they are as building materials.</p>	<p>Look for seasonal changes around you. Collect autumnal objects you find.</p> <p>Talk about the materials that objects and buildings are made from. Use language such as hard, soft, clear, solid, stretchy, bendy, rough and smooth to describe them.</p>
