### This week at Aslacton

Owls have been investigating where their new core story might be set. We have decided it may be set in France. We also started a new class story about a dog called Claude and his best friend Sir Bobblysock! In Geography we found out the name of the capital city of France and looked at and drew some famous landmarks. This week, Kestrels have started their new core story, The Secret Of Black Rock by Joe Todd-Stanton. We have thought about what the 'secret' might be by drawing our own illustrations of Black Rock. In science, we have talked about balanced diets, what this might look like and how food labels can help us to learn about the nutritional content of different foods. In maths, we have practised telling the time on an analogue clock. Eagle Class have been reading and interpreting line graphs and pie charts. We have used our fraction, angle and percentage knowledge to calculate statistics. In English, we have read another Caribbean story and planned our own stories around the same structure. In Geography, we have located and mapped the 54 countries of the Commonwealth and studied The Commonwealth Charter. In Science, we have experimented with water resistance and have started to design our own streamlined boats for a water investigation. Eagles have also recognised Empathy Day by reading a lovely story (The Suitcase) about welcoming newcomers and visitors. A great first week back!
