This week in Aslacton

Eagles have been reflecting and translating shapes using co-ordinates over two and four quadrants. We have extended our plotting skills, and have used mirrors to check reflections over the mirror line. In English, we have designed advertising posters for the Empire Windrush. We have also researched facts and information using the internet to create interesting fact-files about the ship. The children have used historical photographs to gain information and emotion about this period in time. Year 6 have started to reflect upon their year, their memories and the opportunities ahead of them. Fantastic cycling and road safety from all of our year 6 children. Well done! This week in science, Kestrels investigated how muscles and bones work together to create movement. In maths, we recapped column addition and subtraction, then applied these skills to solve missing number problems. In English, we've researched different types of sea creatures and will use this knowledge when we write our own stories next week. Owls have been finding out about all the ways we can keep ourselves healthy. We spent a morning learning how to get help for a conscious and unconscious patient and how to put each other in the recovery position. We have also designed and made posters about healthy eating that we hope to display near the school kitchen.

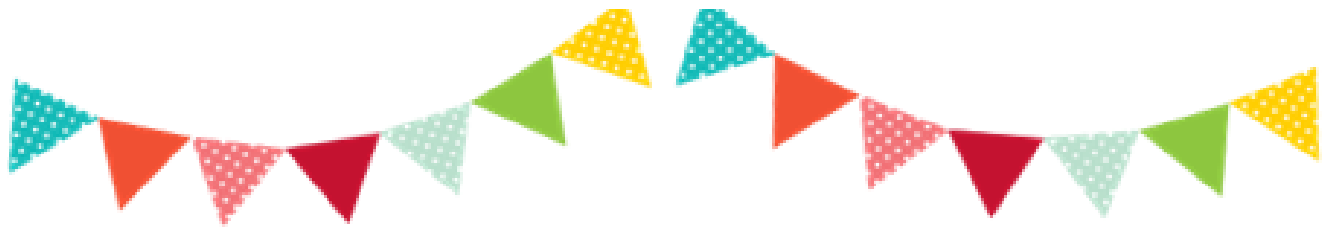
